A LEGAL LEGEND.

The Tale of a Telling Comparison in an Oriental Court.

A Wonderful Escape.

Fieschi tried to assassinate King Louis Philippe of France in July, 1835. The king was riding along the lines of the national guard in the Boulevard du Temple. There came a crash and a rush of bullets. Louis Philippe's arm was grazed, his horse was shot in the neck. Marshal Mortier fell dead and about thirteen other people were killed and thirty wounded. Fieschi had taken the upper floors of a house several weeks before and there rigged up an oak frame four feet by three feet six inches, supported on four posts of oak and itself supporting twenty-five gun barrels fixed in grooves at various angles so as to command an area of twenty-five feet in length and ten feet in height. When he fired the train of powder that let off his battery the king would have been killed if four barrels had not burst and two missed fire.

Big Four Plans Consolidation.

Cincinnati, O., Nov. 25.—In pursuance of the policy of consolidation mapped out by the New York Central lines, the stockholders of the Cleveland, Cincinnati, Chicago and St. Louis Railway met here today and gave approval to the plan of the directors for the purchase and consolidation of a number of subsidiary lines heretofore owned by the Big Four. Of the lines to be consolidated the most important is the Cairo, Vincennes and Chicago, which has 463 miles of road extending from Terre Haute to Danville on the north, to Cairo on the south, and to East St. Louis on the west.

Trial in Night Rider Case.

Owensboro, Ky., Nov. 25.—The case of J. F. Van Hoose against A. B. Robinson and 18 other defendants came up for trial in the federal court here today. The case is one of the many night rider cases pending in the federal court in western Kentucky. Van Hoose is seeking damages on the ground that he was driven out of Christian county by the alleged threats of the defendants. In a former trial he was awarded a judgment of \$2,500.

Waynesboro, Ga., Nov. 25.—With a week or more of field events in prospect, dog owners and their handlers with their strings of honor winners assembled here in numbers today to compete for purses and trophies in the annual trials of the Continental Field Trial club.
