Stores Tomorrow.

TURKEYS CLIMB HIGH.

Turkey meat has jumped—upward. Idaho, Wallowa and even other districts have supplied the La Grande markets with turkeys today that sell from 25¢ to 28¢, the top price being demanded by a big percentage of the birds on sale, for despite the shortage of turkeys, the offerings have been of a very good grade generally. Local dealers had a considerable supply on hand this morning, but just how brisk the demand is going to be at the prices named, remains for the week to develop.

One thing that housewives better remember this week, is to lay in stores sufficient on Wednesday to last through Thursday—that big gobbler day. While the movement is still going the rounds without definite decision, it is pretty certain that the grocery stores in La Grande will be closed all day. The meat markets may not close all day but will at least close after 1 o'clock or so; complete announcement along these lines will be made tomorrow so there will be ample time to provide Thanksgiving luxuries and necessities are plentiful this year, but of course many commodities have a stiff price to them, yet this is a prosperous community and few indeed there are in La Grande who will not sit themselves down to a well-provided dinner table next Thursday.

Prices for Thanksgiving week will probably not vary much, at least there were few, if any, material changes on Monday morning just before Thanksgiving. Turkeys alone jumped as the demand for the popular birds grew steady.
