### THE FRIENDLESS SPIDER.

He's a Pretty Good Insect in Spite of His Looks and His Webs.

In the light of present scientific knowledge the story of the spider and the fly that was invited into the pretty parlor does not cause such a surge of sympathy for the fly as it once did.—Harper's Weekly.
