CITY GROWS WITH SPEED

INSURANCE MAN REMARKS ABOUT GROWTH.

Notes wholesale Houses and Factories that have Sprung up.

When people remain in the same town and see little of the country about them and rely upon the newspapers for all their information, they are not in a position as a rule to get the full view of things. A visitor to the city of La Grande has this to say about the city:

La Grande has made greater advancement and growth since my last visit which is a year ago, than any other city in Eastern Oregon. So said E. N. Story, agency supervisor of the Oregon Life Insurance company, to a representative of the Observer. "When the Panama canal is opened this city is destined to become the jobbing center of no mean importance. I see your city and the surrounding country is loyal to your local wholesale houses and factories. A campaign ought to be started to increase the sale of Oregon made goods and especially La Grande made goods. I had no idea that you had the large institutions you have here. Take for instance the plant of the Grande Ronde Meat Company. I am told this company packs about 5000 hogs a year, besides killing in the neighborhood of 1200 cattle, to say nothing of the veal, mutton and poultry. Suppose the buyers of the Grande Ronde Valley bought made in Oregon products, it would quadruple the pay roll of this city. That means more clothes, more groceries, more shoes and more entertainment for the La Grande merchants. Every dollar kept here its worth every ten sent out. Every farm adjacent to the city benefits by the increased sale of its products."

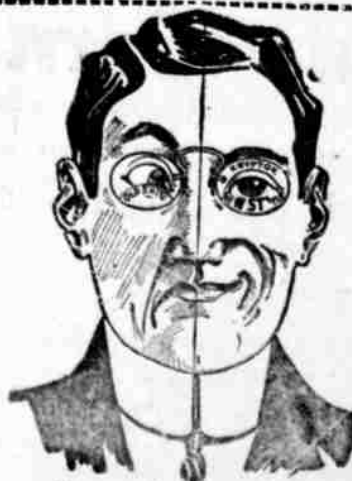
