Stereopticon Will Show Scenes in Asia at High School.

The first stereopticon study will be presented by the eighth grade of the public schools this evening in the high school auditorium. Scenes in Asia will be the subject and a number of interesting slides are in readiness for the exhibition. This is the first practical demonstration of the new stereopticon equipment added to the school and it will be interesting to everyone in the city. The admission is free and everyone is welcome, according to Prof. Stödt. "We would like to have an overflow meeting tonight in the auditorium," continued the superintendent of schools, "for we feel this added improvement will not only benefit the children but it will help every adult who will attend."

The adoption of the stereopticon places the La Grande schools a notch higher than the school of cities of this size for very few have them in operation at present.
