FANCY STEERS WEIGH 4500 LBS.

McKENNON TURNS TWO BIG CATTLE DEALS.

Will Take Shipment to Portland Markets Saturday Night.

One of the big deals in cattle to be transacted this winter was the purchase yesterday and the day before by J. D. McKennon of two herds of cattle matured in this valley. The Glenn herd of 218 head was purchased by McKennon and the Chadwick herd of 70 cattle has also been bought by McKennon. He will leave Saturday night for Portland with the shipment.

Prize Steers Included.
Among the Chadwick herd were two prize steers which Mr. McKennon hopes to unload at lucrative prices for the Christmas trade. The two weigh 4500 pounds and will be sought by fancy handlers in Portland. Top prices for beef on the hoof is \$6.50 but it takes top material to command that price. Less fancy stuff goes at 6 cents and less.

J. E. Reynolds bought from McKennon, later, 50 head of calves and cows out of the Glenn herd.
