PLENTY MUTTON

POST SEASON HAS BEEN FAVORABLE.

Increasing Demand for Mutton Will Be Supplied.

Regardless of what the wool tariff may end up with, there will be plenty of good mutton on the markets next year. The splendid range grass over all Eastern Oregon ranges this year has prepared flocks for a severe winter if such should result, and to all appearances Eastern Oregon consumers of mutton will not have to pay very high prices for their favorite meat dish. This, too, is encouraging in view of the fact that mutton has in the last year or so become a much more popular food stuff than it has usually been. Speaking of the sheep conditions, the following is quoted from Pendleton:

"My foreman at Arlington tells me that the grass on the range is now better than he has seen at this time of the year for 15 years," says Dan P. Smythe, extensive woolgrower and for many years secretary of the state association. "The good condition is due mainly to the fact of the good rains last spring. The sheep did well on the summer ranges because of much grass and moisture. Then when the ycame down to the winter range the found much good dry grass to eat. That feed kept the sheep going well until the green grass was ready. They are now in splendid shape and should go through the winter well. The indications now are that the wool next spring will be heavy and of good quality. The quality and quantity of wool born by a sheep depends very largely on the physical condition of the sheep. If the sheep gets into bad shape the wool clip is light and the wool of poor grade."
