TURKEYS ARE 1 CENT LOWER

DUCKS, TOO, COME DOWN A PENNY FOR XMAS.

Mutton Creeps Half a Cent as Yuletide Draws Near.

A glance at the local market report for Thanksgiving and the one appended below will show that turkeys have declined a cent, in spite of the fact that nearly all shipments are from Idaho. Live ducks have come down a penny and sheep have crept up a half cent. The latter are hard to get and are drawn from the Wallowa country. Beef will continue strong because of the fact that there are no cattle feeding in the valley. Hogs are plentiful and the market is declining.

A tempting variety of Xmas goodies are in the stores with prices about the same all around, save oranges. These are selling at 25 to 60c. Storage eggs have advanced in some of the stores and are selling at 40c. Butter was fluctuating on account of a quail local war, but prices indicated are the prevailing local prices.
