ESCHEAT CASE FINALLY ENDS

A Salem special says: Declaring that the state cannot quarrel with itself the supreme court has dismissed the appeal which was brought in the case of the state vs. P. A. McDonald, as administrator of the estate of John Morrison, deceased, et al., appealed from Union county. This is the most widely known escheat case ever contested in Oregon and has been in the courts for many years.

Charles E. and George T. Cochran were employed as special counsel by the governor. When the case was finally remanded to the court below Cochran & Cochran filed a motion to direct the sale of real property involved and with the motion an affidavit was filed, setting out the services they had performed, accompanied by affidavits of many attorneys throughout the state as to what reasonable attorneys' fees would be in the case.

The court gave the associate counsel \$7,500. Shortly afterward Governor West, by Attorney-General Crawford, moved the court to set the order aside as far as it relates to attorney's fees, but the motion was overruled and an appeal was taken. This appeal was dismissed today and it is probably this will be the closing feature in the Morrison case.
