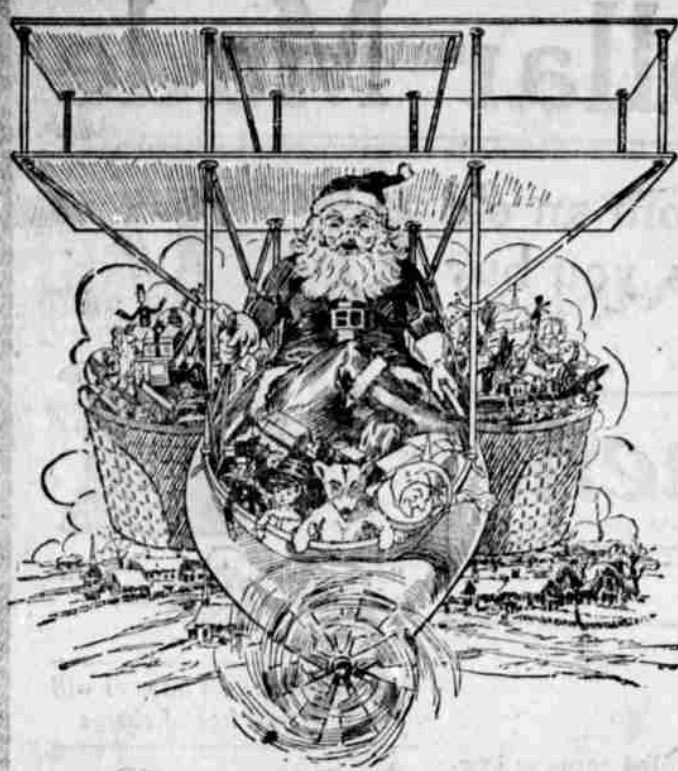

THREE LEAVE FOR PRISON

**PLEAS OF GUILTY FILED BY
THREE.**

**Willie Wilkie Obtains More Time in
Which to File Plea.**

On the strength of pleas of guilty Circuit Judge Knowles has sent a delegation of three to the state institution at Salem where a few days ago occurred a hanging bee. Bert Shirley, accused of assault with intent to commit rape pleaded guilty when arraigned this week and received sentence of one to ten years; R. S. Rickertson, charged with and pleading guilty to larceny in a dwelling, one to seven years; Charles Webb, pleading guilty to a charge of burglary in a dwelling house in the night time, two to 15 years.

Willie Wilkie, accused of illicit selling of liquor, was arraigned but asked for more time to file his plea, which Judge Knowles allowed.
