suance of a resolution adopted by
the common council of the city of
La Grande, Oregon, on the 2nd day
of October, 1912, creating improve-
ment district No. 75 and designating
Washington avenue (north side) as
such district, and in pursuance of a
resolution adopted by said common
council on the 11th day of December,
1912, whereby said council determined
and declared its intention to im-
prove all of Washington avenue in
said improvement district, as here-
inafter described, by constructing
sidewalk, the council will, ten
days after the service of this notice
upon the owners of the property af-
fected and benefited by such improve-
ment, order that said above described
improvement be made; that the
boundaries of said district to be so
improved are as follows:

All that portion of the north side
of Washington avenue, from the east
curb line of Spruce street to the west
curb line of Cherry street.

All the property affected or bene-
fited by said improvement is as fol-
lows:

All of lots 5, 6, 7, and 8, block 7;
lots 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12, block 6,
Coggan's addition to La Grande; lots
4, 5 and 6, Blumenstein's sub-division
block W, Coggan's second addition to
La Grande; lot 13, block 6, Cog-
gan's second addition to La Grande;
the south half of block V, Coggan's
second addition to La Grande.

the council will levy a special assess-
ment for the purpose of paying for
