BUZUKOS IS BIG QUITTER

O'CONNELL'S FOE QUILTS AT PENDLETON.

Total Stranger, However, Comes to the Front and Is Tartar.

After bleating around here for two week that he had chased Eddle O'Connell of Portland all over the northwest in vain, trying to pin him down for a welterweight championship wrestling match, Peter Buzukos, the Greek, absolutely refused to go on Christmas afternoon at the Oregon theatre, and The Unknown saved the day, says the Pendleton Live Wire.

The Unknown was Ed. Alho, a big Finn, muscled like Hercules. He jumped in when Buzukos welched and gave O'Connell 47 minutes of fast, fierce and clever work. Alho proved a great surprise.

Buzukos said he refused to wrestle because the house wasn't big enough to warrant his risking his reputation against a man like O'Connell. But the debonair Irishman was ready and willing to give the fans a run for their money anyway, and he was applauded for his game spirit.

Alho was greeted with cheers when he jumped onto the stage, an absolute stranger, and said in a duke's mixture of English and Finnish: "I'm sport. I rastle for any money or for fifteen sen. I show you big time, too, if I can go on."

O'Connell good-naturedly accepted the challenge and found that he had struck a Tartar. Alho was wise to all the tricks and no one was amazed when, after the match, the word passed around that Alho had been a wrestling instructor. He came here recently from Kellogg, Idaho, where he had been running a gymnasium.

O'Connell won the first fall in 32 minutes with a body scissors and hammerlock combination hold. After 10 minutes' intermission hold, they went to it again and Eddie got such a fierce hammerlock on Alho in 15 minutes that the big Finn was forced to surrender or sustain broken bones, so he yelled "enough."
