Boys' Conference

La Grande had three representatives at the Idaho and Eastern Oregon Boys' conference which was held at Payette, Idaho, Dec. 27-29-30-31. The conference opened Friday night with nearly all delegates present. One of our far east as Pocatello and as far west as our city were seated in the opening session. La Grande immediately stepped to the front when Leslie Little was elected first vice president of the association. The address of the evening, "Standards of Responsibility," was given by O. W. The day was topped off with a splendid banquet in the Y. M. C. A. where Wm. C. Dunbar of Boise gave a magnificent address, using as his subject, "Responsibility of True Citizenship."
