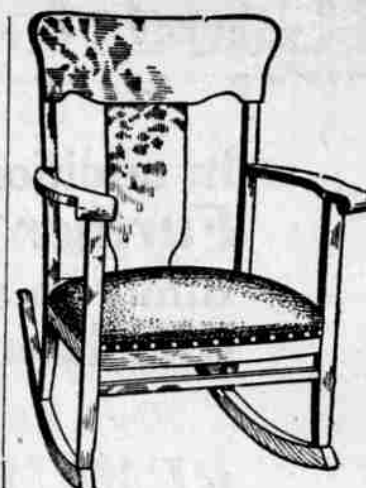

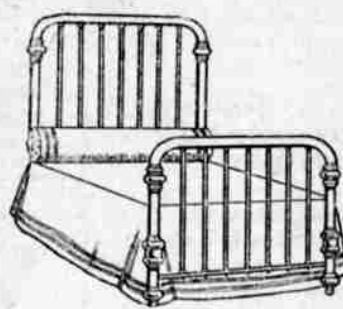

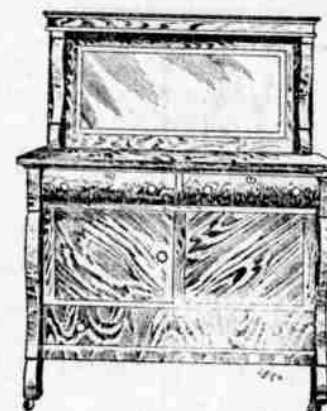

BUILD S. V. ROAD TO BURNS OR.

and speculation were aroused over the reported announcement of W. H. Eccles, the new president of the Sumpter Valley railroad that the road is to be extended into Burns as soon as conditions shall warrant the investment, say the Ba-

ker Herald of Wednesday. Mr. Eccles is on his way to Baker today so could not be seen and Joseph Barton, assistant superintendent of the road said he knew nothing of the matter.

The statement, however, is a posi-

tive one that the Eccles interests have been looking over the field and intend to extend their line to Burns. When the road shall deem the conditions right is the question that leaves the matter to the future.

The announcement says that the company has already laid out two alternate surveys from Prairie City, the present terminus of the line, to Burns, and into the Harney valley, and it is still a matter for consideration which route will be adopted. At present the Sumpter Valley

line is operated between Baker and Prairie City.

By either of the two tentative routes Burns can be reached at a grade of not to exceed 3 per cent, and without requiring particularly heavy construction work.
