ORANGES ARE GOING UPWARD

TEN-CENT RAISE PER DOZEN IS FELT HERE.

Frosted Fruit, It Is Feared, Will Be Dumped on Markets.

Oranges in wholesale lots on the Portland markets have advanced 50 cents a box, and in La Grande retail prices have gone up 10 cents per dozen, all grades. The supply is very limited and will not last more than a week at the most. It is feared that

Portland will be made the dumping ground for much of the frozen fruit and the dealers are sending out the warning to beware of the quality. Frost does not injure the exterior of the fruit but the inside is dry and fibrous.

The supply of vegetables will not last more than a week and from then on the price will incline sharply. The high price of vegetables will be only temporary, however, for with good weather a new crop will be on the market in the course of a month.

Cattle have declined a few cents and hogs have gone up. Sheep have held their own in all of the markets of the United States and no sudden change is looked for in the price.

Wheat has gone up a few cents in all of the foreign markets and the price of flour per barrel in the Port-

land market is from 20 to 30 cents higher. The price of wheat on the track has not changed, but a rise of a cent or two is bound to come with the increase in price in the Paris, London and Berlin markets.
