**VACCINATION
REAL PANACEA**

STATES THAT ENFORCE LAWS ARE PEST-FREE.

Western States Among Lax and Disease Rates High.

In the states where vaccination is strictly enforced, the number of contagious diseases is greatly reduced. The government has just issued statistics on vaccination for smallpox. In it is pointed out that in Maine where the quarantine and vaccination laws are strict, there were in 1911, 68 cases of smallpox and no deaths; in Massachusetts—only 11 cases; in New York 337 cases.

On the other hand, in Texas where laws are lax there were 687 cases and 51 deaths. In Utah were 1660 cases and 8 deaths; Washington 979 cases and in Oregon, another lax state if vaccination matters, 206 cases. The parallel is apparent," said a La Grande physician in commenting on the needs of strict vaccination laws in all states. "In states of large cities, the results would be serious if it was not for well regulated quarantine and vaccination laws."
