STEER-BEEF KEEPS HIGH

HOGS HOLD STEADY PRICE IN THE STATE.

Head Lettuce Most Freely Traded in Vegetable.

There is nothing startling or even interesting in the local or the Portland markets today. Fancy light cows have taken a spurt and have set a new mark for the Portland yards. The best are quoted at \$7.25. That is taken to indicate that the shortage in steer beef is going to run up the price of everything that is eatable. Little cow meat comes to the Portland yards and the local butchers declare that the percentage of cow meat sold in this shops is about 25 per cent. Not many years ago it was hard to get steer beef on the local market but the fact that farmers are holding their stock to replenish herds will make cow meat rather scarce on the local market.

Hogs Are Steady.

Hogs are holding their own and the price has been at the same figures for the last week or more. Chicago markets would indicate that there is no dearth of hogs and that the price

will not be excessive.

Vegetables Still Coming.

Head lettuce is about the only green stuff that comes from out of the city. Most of the truck gardeners have put away immense supplies of carrots, turnips and cabbage and celery, and the same can be had at very reasonable figures. Walla Walla is sending some green stuff to the local market and from the reports of the merchants there will be vegetables on hand for some time to come, but the price will be fancy.

No Frozen Oranges in Portland

The commission men and the merchants of Portland have agreed that they will allow no frozen fruit on the market. This is comforting in view of the fact that the California people have taken advantage of the Oregonians in past years, and dumped all of the worthless stuff on an unsuspecting people.

Frozen fruit looks like non frozen fruit but the difference is juice and no juice when the orange is cut.

Wheat Still Climbing.

Bluestem and all of the other brands are making steady gains on all of the markets of the world, and will soon affect the price of flour. On the La Grande market no change has come about in the price.
