Department Called Out by Unlucky Number to Fight Fire.

Thirteen, the unlucky number, was the signal of La Grande's fire department alarm code that was used yesterday evening in calling on the department to quell a fire that threatened to gut the entire block of frame buildings adjoining the apartments of Emma Williams on Jefferson. The blaze threatened to fire the City livery barn and all of the building in the block on Jefferson avenue. The car made a fine run in spite of the deep snow and in less than three minutes after the machine left the fire station the fire ladders were playing a gushing stream of water on the devouring flames. The fire had not gotten much headway and was confined to only one of the upper rooms. All of the property in that room was destroyed by the flames and much of the house was so thoroughly gutted with water that the loss will amount to about \$500, fully covered by insurance. Emma Williams and other inmates of the house found shelter in the adjoining houses on Jefferson.
