BAKER AFTER GAMBLERS

Raid Brings a Half Dozen Into Law's Net at Baker.
 (Baker Democrat.)

District Attorney C. T. Godwin made the first real loud noise of his term of office yesterday, when acting under information supplied by one who had been taking part in company with Constable Palmer, he was responsible for the raiding of a gambling house over the Fawn saloon and the arrest of eight inmates, including the alleged proprietor, Ben Hodge.

It all came about through a Greek who, after losing several hundred dollars yesterday forenoon, went to the district attorney with his complaint. Investigation indicated the existing condition and early in the afternoon the coup was pulled off. According to those present, the district attorney and constable walked right in when the game was running full blast, and so quickly did events move that all were under arrest and the whole layout, including poker chips, and cards, confiscated for evidence.

Those arrested were Ben Hodge, Frank Goodman, Chris Mandes, Geo. T. Sourris, (the two latter Greeks) and Robert Smith. These were arrested as principals and Edwin Patrick, Hank Aldrich and James C. Cox were taken into custody as witnesses.

At their preliminary hearing before Justice of the Peace Woodson L. Patterson all were bound over to the grand jury, bail being set in the sum of \$50.

When questioned as to whether this was the first move in a "clean-up program", District Attorney Godwin answered in part as follows: "No, we have not started a special crusade of this kind, but this affair was brought to my notice and action taken, as it will be whenever a matter of this kind comes up."
