WOMEN CLERKS ANGERED

Secretary of the Treasury Has Trouble With Treasury Heads.

Washington, Jan. 27.—Secretary of the Treasury MacVeagh is pondering these days over the perversity of woman. Also a perfectly good room in the treasury department is going to waste.

It is all the outgrowth of a feud which the women clerks of the treasury are waging against their chief. For years and years these clerks—many of them are middle aged ladies—have been bringing their lunches with them to the office, and utilizing convenient gas jets for the boiling of tea and coffee. Little luncheon parties were formed and the ladies spent their half hour of the recess period in gossip, doing fancy work or knitting.

MacVeagh didn't like the practice. He did what he could to break it up by frowning disapproval. Then, finally, he got an idea, and had the public health service hold that the cooking and lunching in the working rooms was unsanitary. An official order was issued on this authority, banning the tea and coffee drinking and the luncheon parties. The women rebelled. Some even took the matter to their congressmen with the plaint that the order was a hardship on the smaller salaried clerks, since it forced them to buy their lunches, whereas before they could get a "snack" at noon out of home leftovers.

MacVeagh had to capitulate gracefully. But he didn't restore the lunching privilege. The public health service opinion that lunching in the work rooms was unsanitary stuck in the way of resuming the old plan. So the secretary decided on a regular luncheon room. He cleared out a fine, large sunny room, had it fitted up with nice tables, put in little gas stoves for the coffee and tea making, and installed comfortable chairs. An official order conveyed the invitation to all employes to make themselves at home during the luncheon period in this room.

But the women clerks were peeved. A week went by and not a soul used the nicely fitted room. More than a month has now gone, and still the cookstoves and chairs and tables are unused. The clerks have a first-class "boycott" against it.

Chief Clerk Wilmett says he cannot explain the queer lack of appreciation on the part of the women clerks.
