Transaction Stimulates People.
The deal of last evening has acted as a stimulant throughout the city and today many are commenting on it. Cod Liver Oil From Sharks.
Shark spearing is a profitable industry in Malaysia, though attended by an element of danger and no little excitement. The chief value of the fish is its liver, which yields an oil that is refined in Europe and sold as cod liver oil. In October the ocean sharks come into the moon between the barrier reef and the atolls, to pair. At this time they can be speared in large numbers by people skilled in catching them. There are several species of these sharks, and they ordinarily run from seven to fifteen feet in length. The liver of a shark of this size gives about five gallons of oil. The sharks are found in pairs, and the tapooners try to kill the male first, for they are then able to spear the female also, as it does not desert its mate.
