# THE ROSARY NEXT SHOW

At the present day when so many plays are being presented which deal with questionable subjects, it is a relief to turn to a drama which breathes purity and good fellowship and leads the way to a brighter view of life and humanity.

# White Slavers Apprehended.

(Pendleton Live Wire.)  
The police made a very important arrest last night when called to the house of Mrs. George Froome on the northwest corner of Garden and Court streets. It was there found that F. A. Nixon and Fred Parson had been living for two weeks with Dora Penfield and Daisy Schultz, though never married. It is charged. They were arrested under a city ordinance, charged with being guilty of acts involving immoral practices, and were locked up. The men were placed in jail and the women turned over to Mrs. Ira Hughes who was appointed as special officer to take care of them until trial.

E. L. Wells, U. S. immigration officer at Walla Walla, was notified and came over this morning to take the testimony of the women. It has been ascertained that they were formerly residents of North Yakima, both women having been divorced, one three months ago, and the other six. One had formerly been employed in a steam laundry in that city. The men first brought them to Walla Walla where they resided a short time, afterwards coming here. It was shown that the women have been sent out on the street to solicit the attentions of other men to raise money for their male companions. One of the women returned home last evening without the cash her companion thought she should have earned, and he proceeded to give her a thrashing for being so idle. This raised a row and Mrs. Froome called in the police, when the arrest of all four was made. This morning the men were given a fine by the police judge of \$25 or 12 days in jail and the women remanded to the care of Mrs. Hughes. This fine

was given simply to hold them until Mr. Wells could have an opportunity to get them on the stronger charge of white-slavery, which the police say is the charge they are really guilty of. It is said that the defendants are making very poor witnesses for themselves, as they were kept separate since the arrest and their several stories do not come very close together, but everything points to it being a case of white slavery on the part of the men. At the time of going to press there are still two or three witnesses to examine, but the testimony is not thought to be favorable to the accused.
