BEETLE HAS DONE HARM

DEPARTMENT ESTIMATES OVER 8,000,000 TREES WERE KILLED.

Private Individuals Have Conducted Campaign in Eastern Oregon.

The secretary of agriculture announces that investigations conducted in 1907 and 1910 to determine the conditions on an area of more than 1,000,000 acres in northeastern Oregon showed that the killing of a large number of trees by the mountain pine beetle had been going on in this area since 1905. It was estimated that 35 per cent of the lodgepole pine on about 1,000,000 acres and 50 per cent of the matured lodgepole on 800,000 acres of the same area had been killed or a total of over 800,000 trees. It was also estimated that 140,000 yellow pine had been killed by this beetle and that the invasion was moving south and southeast into more valuable areas of yellow pine.

In order to demonstrate the practicability of the control measures recommended by the expert on Forest Insects of the bureau of Entomology, an area of about 90,000 acres principally in the yellow pine was selected in which to conduct a beetle control project.

In the spring and summer of 1912 a thorough inspection was made of the treated area. It was found that on the 87,950 acres of the treated area the number of trees killed by the insects had decreased 32,480, more than 80 per cent while or some untreated check area the increase was 240 per cent.

After a brief recess a constitution and by-laws were adopted as recommended by the committee. The chief features of these are the name of the club, the placing of the dues at \$2 a year and forbidding gambling in any form on the grounds.

The committee on nominations reported the following: J. P. Winter, president; J. J. Hamley, vice president; Dr. J. E. Sharp secretary and W. L. Thompson treasurer. Mr. Thompson said he would be unable to serve and William Hale's name was sub-

stituted. With this change the report was adopted and the nominees of the committee were made the elected officers of the club for the ensuing year.

Gus Peret of Portland, who was present, was instructed to telephone to Portland today and make arrangements for one of the latest automatic traps which will be used by the club. The trap was accordingly ordered this morning and will be here in a few days.

HOLD WOOL AGES HOKE

A good bit of advice concerning the selling of wool on the sheep's back is given out by the Secretary of the Woolgrowers' association, John G. Hoke of Medical Springs. The following is taken from the Baker Democrat:

"Sheepmen and wool growers of this section of the country should not be anxious to contract their crops early this year," said John G. Hoke of Medical Springs, secretary of the Oregon Wool Growers' association, last evening to a representative of the Democrat. "This idea of contracting the wool on the sheep's backs at this time is not to the best interest of the growers and they should wait a while. I am in constant receipt of communications from buyers and those in close touch with the wool situation at the wool centers and am certain that prices a little later will be good and that those who hold off for a time will better themselves greatly. The buyers will be after mutton fed stock, and the prices will be good; of this I am certain.

"The outlook is very good now and the growers have every season to feel optimistic and they will feel much better satisfied with a good price later on than sacrificing the same by contracting now, as some are doing and many are contemplating, according to my own certain knowledge of local conditions. Take it from me, in spite of the tariff, it will be a good year for the sheep men of Eastern Oregon, and those who do not act hastily but hold back contracting their wool will certainly have cause to be glad that they did so."
