Cape Sanders that she is en route to Port Lyttelton "because of a grave calamity." Wellington dispatchs make it almost certain that 66 are dead.

The Wellington dispatchs give but scattering details of the disaster. From a brief and unsatisfactory wireless dispatch from the Terra Nova, only outlines of the tragedy have been gained so far. However, it is learned that records found with the bodies show that Scott reached the exact spot where Captain Amundson planted the Norwegian flag on the South pole, and the British party used the hut erected by the Norwegian explorers.

**Scott of Good Connections.** Captain Scott was an officer of the British navy and belonged to one of the illustrious families of the empire. He commanded the discovery expedition of the Antarctic in 1904. Scott's latest trip cost over \$200,000 and was subsidized by the British people and the British government. He set sail from London on the Terra Nova on June first, stopping at New Zealand on his way to Ross sea in the antarctic regions.

The report that Scott and 65 of his companions had been frozen created the biggest sensation of a decade. Mrs. Scott Sails.

San Francisco, Feb. 10.—Mrs. Scott wife of the captain, sailed from here on Wednesday to welcome her husband. Before leaving Mrs. Scott predicted that her husband would not reach civilization for at least two months.

**BASEBALL MOGULS HERE.** C. A. Hosler of Baker, President W. N. Sweet of Boise, E. B. Sherman and Secretary N. M. Brown of Walla Walla, are here today in the interest of league baseball. They are conferring with local business men this afternoon.

**Fat Hogs Sold.** Pierce and Johnson of near La Grande sold 60 hogs to the La Grande Meat company. The price was \$6.60 per hundred. All of the hogs will be slaughtered for local consumption.

**Farmers Want a Chance.** Tom Fleming, manager of the Eastern Oregon Telephone company; Mr. McGinnis, president of the company and H. H. Hug, secretary, were in La Grande last Saturday to attend the meeting of the joint committee of city councilmen and members of the telephone company. In speaking of the franchise Mr. McGinnis said: "All we want is a sample room in which to show what the people's telephone has got. La Grande is the business, social and traffic center of the county and we recognize this. That's why we are anxious to get the franchise to bring the people's telephone system into the city. At the present time Union has 65 phones, Cove has forty and ten more applicants. Elgin has 175 in operation and Summerville has a hundred besides the phones scattered throughout the valley.

"Baker and Umatilla counties will organize an association on the same line as ours. When they are completed, we will be in a position to make connections with all of these counties. Both of the counties are busy with the proposition and it will be but a short time until the three counties will be connected by the People's phone."
