WHEAT FALLS OFF IN MANY
MARKETS
Fish for Lenten Observers Continues
to Be Plentiful.

Hogs took another spurt yesterday and the best sold for eight cents. Other grades sold accordingly. The market was not overcrowded and the demand was good. Cattle seems to have reached the top notch price, and are either unwilling to go beyond the present figures, or some one has said that they shall not. In either event the price to the shinner will go on the market at the same figures for the year.

Wheat Declines
Owing to the crop reports from India that rain had relieved the drought and the threatened shortage of the growing crop, wheat fell

In all of the principal markets of the world. In some instances the fall was over a cent, which would indicate that dollar wheat is not quite as certain as wheat exports on the Pacific coast predicted. However, between now and harvest so many things can happen that their dream will yet be realized.

Vegetables Scarce.
With the advance of the winter season and the diminishing supply of vegetables in the local sellers, vegetables will not be seen on the local market very long. But the interim is bound to be of short duration on account of the hot house stuff that will come before the snow has entirely melted. There are a number of smaller green houses in and around La Grande and their offerings in the way of offerings in lettuce, radishes and onions will relieve the situation until warm weather allows of gardening.
