SUMMERVILLE IS DRY.
 Saloon License Is Denied Applicant—
 Other News Items.
 Summerville, Feb. 13.—(Special)—
 At the special meeting of the city council this week the application of Joe See for a renewal of saloon license was refused. At the last city election the line was quite clearly drawn between the wets and the dries, and a council was elected, the majority of which was supposed to be dry; but one, John Schleppey, failed to qualify, and at the special meeting Feb. 10 W. R. Chattin was elected to fill the vacancy. Under the head of new business the application of Mr. See was presented, and Councilman Oswald moved that a license be granted him, but the motion failed to receive a second, thus being lost.
 Mr. Hans Hacker, living a few miles northwest of town, had the misfortune to cut his foot quite badly with an axe a few days ago. Dr. Whiting of Elgin was called upon to dress the wound.
 About half a million feet of logs are piled up in the yards of A. Klees & Son. They expect to employ about fifty men this summer, which will make a substantial pay-roll for Summerville.
 On next Sunday night Rev. Frank J. Bradley will deliver an address at the M. E. Church on the "Life and Work of Abraham Lincoln".
 The snow in this part of the valley is deeper than usual this year, about three feet on the level and badly drifted, many drifts being from eight to twelve feet deep.
