**SPRING MAY
FORCE A RISE**

**SHORTAGE OF FODDER BULLS
MEAT PRICES.**

General Review of the Week's Ending
in Various Edible Lines.

It is likely that with the slow advent of spring the price of beefs and hogs will be up on account of the pasturage. The local market ought to be affected to some extent on account of the shortage of fodder in the southern Idaho country. Most of La Grande's meat comes from Nampa, but owing to the fact that it is contracted ahead of time and has been prepared for the local market the shipments are on the whole very good. Less than 25 per cent of the meat consumed in this city is cow meat and the quality on the whole as good as Armour or Swift's best.

Hogs Higher Still.

But one load of hogs arrived in the Portland market yesterday and the price went up to \$8.95 for the best. This would make hogs on the local market worth \$7.65 for the best grades and correspondingly lower prices for the less desirable. The Chicago market is showing even better prices going as high as \$8.35. If the supply in Portland will be the equal of the best prices in the middle west. Cattle held firm even though there were no more cattle on the market than during the week.

Few Sheep Arrive.

But a handful of sheep arrived on the Portland market and the price went up a dime for prime grades. This is better than has been paid for first class offerings for a month

or more. Just how long the advance will hold is not certain.

Oranges must have been stored away in very large quantities before the frost because the price has not changed materially in the past two weeks and the quality on the local market is of the very best. One store is selling a fine grade for 25 cents a dozen. The price ranges from 25 to 60 cents for the big ones and the stock is plentiful.

Walla Walla Celery Good.

Perhaps the best grade of celery in town of the shipped in sort is that from Walla Walla. Some is coming from Portland but the quality cannot be relied on, some shipments being first class and others being very much damaged. The home supply is fresh from the hot beds and of the very best.
