HOPING FOR THAW.

Sheepmen Believe Turn in Weather Due Soon--Many Feeding.

(Enterprise Record-Chieftein).

Range conditions in the sheep country in the eastern part of the county have changed little in the last seven days. Snow five inches deep still covers the north hillsides and lies in the canyons along the Innaha and Snake rivers. But the snow is light and not crusted and sheep are able to graze, not freely as in usual winters, but enough to keep them in fair condition.

In the north and northeast sections in the Joseph creek country, conditions are less favorable. The snow is deeper and has lain on the ground so long that the available grazing spots have been tolerably well eaten off.

Stockmen who have hay are now feeding their herds, both cattle and sheep. Others are staying close with their stock, handling it to make the most of the remaining pasture.

The hope of all is that the weather will moderate very shortly, and the snow melt. For several days there has been every sign of a chinook, or at least a warm spell. The air has been more damp and clouds have been gathering. Men familiar with the climate express confidence that the turn is at hand, and that the long cold spell is about over.

George S. Craig sent word the first of the week to put the Craig and Hansen sheep, ranging on Snake river, on feed at once. Hay enough to feed for three weeks is at hand, and Mr. Craig feels no fear of bringing the stock through in good shape.

W. H. Graves, who went to Snake river last week, wrote back by way of Innaha, that there was five inches of snow on the Snake hills, but it was light and sheep were not suffering. Joe Clemons telephoned from the ranger station on the lower Innaha that Mr. Graves had found conditions on the Snake not so unfavorable as had been feared. Luther Stumbaugh telephoned from the Innaha that his sheep were all right and were not in any danger.

The Jay H. Dobbin sheep, which range in this same general district are reported doing fully as well as the others. Peter Beaudoin has feed enough to take care of stock without good range.
