HERMISTON PROJECTS GROW

SO-CALLED WEST EXTENSION IS NOW UNDER WAY.

Believed Project Will Be Kept Moving Through Summer.

The Hermiston Herald of last Friday has this to say about the activities of engineers on the West extension:

Camp was established on the west side of the river the first of the week and Wednesday morning a crew went out to start the final survey for the main canal. About a dozen men are in the crew with E. I. Davis in charge. They are prepared to camp there while the work is in progress. In addition to a regular camp equipment they have a cook. The camp is established near the West ranch.

As yet no further information has been received at the local reclamation office further than to make the final survey of the main canal for the first unit. It is the general opinion, however, that by the time this work is completed further orders will have been received. While it is possible the start on the extensions may be a little slow, few believe there will be an entire stoppage of work from now on. By early summer it is thought work will be in full swing.

The first unit, on which the work started this week is for, embraces what is now the Oregon Land & Water Power company project, more commonly known as the Irrigon project. This embraces 29,000 acres, only 5,000 of which has ever been irrigated. To supply a better system for that part already under water, as well as to include the unirrigated portion, a new diversion dam and canal will be put in. This will necessitate the reconstruction of practically all the present system.

It is for the permanent survey and location of this main canal that Engineer Davis headed the crew which went out Wednesday morning.

Team Runs Away; One Dead.

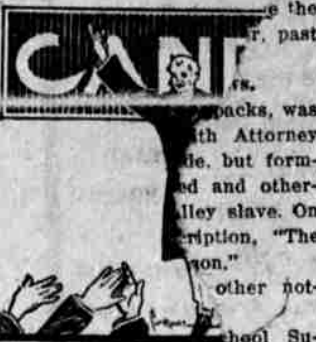
