WALLOWA CASES DECIDED.

Wallowa County to Have 320 Acre Claims, Says Department Ruling

A Washington dispatch says: Notice has been received by Representative Hawley that several townships in Wallowa county have been opened for 320 acre homesteads. A number of settlers there already hold entries but claim a quarter section is not enough to make a living on.

Another tract near Enterprise, withdrawn in 1902 on the supposition that the survey was defective, may be reopened. Some settlers have been living there for 15 years and think they are entitled to patents.

At the U. S. land office, it is stated, that no official or other information, except the press reports, relative to the listing of vacant and unpatented lands in Wallowa county, had been received. Receiver Eberhard states that about 100 persons have filed homestead applications for extra land under the 320 acre homestead act and have appealed from the consequent rejection of them by the local office because the Secretary of the Interior had not acted. Whether the

action now reported will operate retroactively and embrace such applications, he could not say. Announcement will be made by the local office as soon as any definite information is available.

No rush or increase in filing is anticipated by the government land officials as nearly all land in Wallowa county that is probably affected by the Washington announcement now has appealed applications covering it. The over-lap withdrawal has been in force since 1904.
