

EGG MARKET MUCH WEAKER

FRESH SUPPLIES ARE COMING IN WITH A BUSH.

Butter Goes up, Following Raise in Portland Two Days Since.

Butter up and eggs down is the counterbalancing announcement from the La Grande markets today. While it is doubtful that butter will go higher than it did today, coming two days after the Portland boost, there is consolation for the consumer in the very weak state of the egg market. Nice fresh eggs are more than piling in and the prices already at 35c with

plenty of evidence of additional drops. All merchants report weakness in the egg market. The raise of butter was anticipated yesterday following the increase created at Portland.
