

ELKS' ANNUAL BALL AND BANQUET NOW IN HISTORY

Elks and Their Ladies Dance in Roman Forum-like Bower of Beauty—Every Phase up to Highest Standard of Perfection.

La Grande lodge No. 433 B. P. O. E. added another chapter to its profuse social history last evening when the annual ball and banquet was served in a place made extremely beautiful. In brilliancy of dress and gayness of guests, the event was unsurpassed. Costs and expense accounts figure not when Elks give their annuals. The decorations alone cost over \$200 and other expenses were in proportion.

Simple lines were keynotes of the decorations which it is safe to say have never been equalled, primarily because of the newness of lines created. Back of all the ulterior decorations, and covering every inch of wall space and windows as well, was the distinctive blue that marks Elk-

the white ceiling and these light rays were softened by Elk blue which in turn was freely dotted with wistaria and chrysanthemums. With this artistic background the decorators proceeded with the finishing touches and well they succeeded!

The foundation for the finish lay on a series of near-Gothic arches and plain, square pillars of a foot dimension and about half as high as the wall space, the highest point of the connecting arches touching a point about one foot below the ceiling. The pillars were extremely plain adorned with simple, square but attractive entablature, only slightly larger than the columns' top plate. Without frieze or cornice, the arches sat squarely on the miniature entablature but with graceful curves they swung to the adjoining pillars of similar make. The striking effect of this was the Roman forum notion. Though snugly set against the wall, this arch-column affair, winding entirely around the room, was sharply contrasted from the wall via the color route. They were pure white against the blue background but color was lent by closely trailing wistaria vines with their pale-blue pendulous blossoms artistically marking the course of climbing, twisting vines of green. Midway up each colonnade was a cluster of three frosted globe lights.

The music dais was encased in blue and slightly set off with latticed fences. The anteroom was likewise touched off with lattice and wistaria blooms and vines.

The general scheme was worked out of a latent artistic thought long dormant in the brain of E. E. Kirtley, generalissimo of the decoration committee. He caught the idea several years ago in a public building in the east where the colonnade effect was prettily used, and from that piece of architecture he evolved, with the assistance of the rest of the committee, the general scheme as it was perfected last night.
