

JUTE BAG IN BAD REPUTE

RAPID CHANGE TO BULK SHIPMENT SEEN.

High Price of Jute Is Bringing a Speedy Change in Present Plans.

The grain in bulk movement is attracting considerable attention throughout the Pacific Northwest. The doom of the jute bag is seemingly sealed so far as general business is concerned, although for some purposes the bag package will be necessary in commerce. The high prices that have ruled for jute bags during recent years have not been due to

any manipulating influences of Pacific coast interests; contrary to the general ideas held by growers.

The jute that goes to make the grain bag comes mostly from India and the real cause of the high prices will be found there. Improvement in the condition of the workers and a curtailment of the jute crop by Indian growers contribute most to the recent advances in the price of bags.

Changes in the price at Calcutta are quickly followed by a similar movement in values here.
