PARKER TRIAL ORDERED.

Motion Filed by Defendant Is Denied by Circuit Court Today.

Jess Parker, once found guilty of manslaughter in connection with a quarrel with his father-in-law in Elgin will have to stand trial as ordered by the supreme court. Parker was convicted but appealed his case and the higher court returned the case for retrial. Counsel for Parker filed a motion to have the case dismissed in circuit court, holding that under the amendment to the practice code of 1910, it was the duty of the supreme court to finally dispose of the case—either dismiss the charge or uphold the lower court jury. This was argued before Judge Knowles and he today held that he could not disobey the supreme court and if that august body said he should try it, he would do so when the case comes up.
