DOG POISONER IN UNION TOO

VALUABLE CANINE FALLS VICTIM TO DOSE.

Believed Likely That Law Will Be Invoked on the Perpetrator.

(Union Republican.)

There is a dog-poisoner in North Union, and his last Wednesday was picked up by the fine thoroughbred Llewellyn setter, "Bob" owned by Ted Seibird. This animal was valued at \$50, and it is doubtful if it could be replaced for the money. Other dogs will probably get more of the same kind of bait, and it is well for dog-owners to look after their animals. The evidence as to who put out this bait is almost complete, and once the chain is finished it is probable that steps will be taken to prosecute the guilty person.

Following is the law in relation to putting out poison:

Section 1970—If any person shall put out or place any poison where the same is liable to be eaten by any horse, cattle, sheep, hog or other domestic animal of value, the property of another, with intent to poison such animal, such person, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary not less than one nor more than five years, or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than three nor more than twelve months, or by a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$1000.

Under the law a dog is made personal property, is a domestic animal,

with the question of value to be determined. In any event, the scattering of poison is not commendable at any time, and is especially prohibited by law. If the facts necessary for conviction are available, this case will be in the hands of the prosecuting attorney soon. It is about time to make an example of the man who scatters poison.
