Judge Back on the Job.

A little thin and shaky, and plus an auburn beard, Circuit Judge G. W. Phelps returned to his office this morning after an absence of several weeks during which he has been quarantined at his home with smallpox. Work has piled up during his absence and he will have a busy time for a while. The first bill to get his signature was an order requiring all parties claiming to be interested in the estate of the late A. M. Erb to appear before April 22 to show cause why the estate should not revert to the state of Oregon in lieu of any heirs.—Pendleton E. O.

Umatilla County Boy in Baseball.

Leo McQuarry, a former Umatilla county boy, belongs to the pitching staff of the Victoria team of the Northwest league this year, according to a dispatch. Though but seventeen years old, he is looked upon as a comer and Manager Mike Lynch expects to make big timber out of him.

Young McQuarry was born in Milton and lived there until five or six years ago when with his parents he moved to Tacoma. When an eighth grade boy, his twirling attracted attention and during the following summer vacation he pitched in a twilight league in Tacoma. He was but fourteen years old at the time and soon won the pseudonym of "the boy wonder". Bob Brown of Vancouver

signed him when he was fifteen and farmed him out for a couple of years with Moosjaw and Winnipeg teams. Lynch secured him from Brown this year.

Though but a boy in age, young McQuarry has a man's physique, weighing over 190 pounds and having strength in proportion to his weight.

Eloped With Brother's Wife

An elopement, in which the principals were a young man from Caldwell, Idaho and his brother's wife was nipped in the bud here yesterday when the woman's uncle, M. A. Bates, of Parma, Idaho, assisted by the local officers, apprehended the couple in a local lodging house, says the Pendleton E. O. The erring wife was taken back to her husband, while the unnatural brother was put aboard the first westbound train and told to keep away from his home city if he valued his skin. The man, whose name is Henry Lee Rose, arrived here Saturday with his sister-in-law, Elsie Mand Rose. He is 21 years of age and she is 22. Yesterday M. A. Bates who is police judge at Parma, arrived and it was not long before Officer Ira Hughes recognized the couple on the street from the description given. The woman showed a willingness to go back home, but Mr. Bates was afraid to take the man back for fear he would be mobbed by his indignant townsmen. When the couple parted, there was much weeping and wailing and an osculatory goodbye.

3 Outlaws Added to Round-up String.

Three more outlaw bucking bronchos have been added to the Round-up string of bad ones. Each has a established reputation and a proved deviltry and their names are not unfamiliar to the frontier public. "Hot-foot", the notorious little black plunger, and "Whirlwind," a sorrel mustang of goodly proportions, were purchased yesterday by Director Sturgis from John Spain, Union county stockman, who in 1911 won the title of champion broncho buster. A few days previous "Pin Bars", the worst bucking horse that has participated in the Ontario contests, was acquired from Duncan McRae.

Spain is in the city en route home after attending the Rodeo at Los Angeles and he brought with him a string of outlaws. Ever since the 1911 exhibition at which "Hotfoot" proved such a sensation, the Round-up has been trying to purchase the little animal, but Spain has steadfastly refused to part with it until yesterday when he accepted the offer. "Whirlwind" was brought over last year, and though not as spectacular as his mate, is a hard bucker. "Pin Bars" is one of the hardest scrappers in Eastern Oregon and the association feels mighty pleased at adding him to the show string. He is a bay, small in size but a lightning stepper

Eccles' Bond Nine Million.

An Ogden, Utah, dispatch of recent date says:
"Under bonds of the value of \$9,000,000, David C Eccles was appointed administrator of the estate of his father, the late David Eccles. Direct heirs to the estate admitted in the petition for administration include Mrs. Bertha M. Eccles and Mrs. Ellen Eccles and 21 children.

"The amount of the bond is the largest ever required in a civil action in Utah. The administrator furnished a cash bond of \$1,000,000, while the estate itself was accepted as security for the remainder."

Irrigation Contract Ordered.

Spokane, Wash., March 6.—What is believed to be the first contract ever made between the United States of America and an irrigation district was filed in Kittitas county, west of Spokane, when the secretary of the Kittitas reclamation project recorded an agreement with the government to furnish storage water for the \$5,000,000 high line canal.

The document bears the signature of Walter L. Fisher, secretary of the interior. Water for the high line canal will be furnished by the federal government from the storage reservoirs at the head of the Yakima river delivery to be made in 1916, or in 1915, if necessary. Water for 70,000 acres in the district will cost \$82,000 payable in three installments. The contract with the government was secured after many months of negotiations, participated in by Secretary Fisher, representing the government, and Thomas Haley, president; C. W. Johnstone, secretary, and Carrol B. Graves, attorney, representing the irrigation district. The irrigation season will be open from April 20 to September 30.
