# WATER TANK NOW COMPLETE

SIXTY-THOUSAND GALLON CAPACITY AND STANDS HIGH

Standpipes Through the Yards to Be Fed From Big Tank Hereafter.

Capable of holding 60,000 gallons of storage water, the new water tank in the O-W yards has now been completed. While it has not been actually connected up with the water supply, it is in readiness to be so hitched. It will feed all the standpipes in the yard, when in use, and will be used entirely as a reserve tank, and as it stands high in the air, a heavy pressure will be obtainable for all the standpipes and the fire hydrants in the yards as well.

### MATOTT TO BUILD ROAD.

Masters-Ewoldt People to Hurry the Work of New Railroad into Belt.

J. M. Matott has been employed to superintend the construction of the new logging road from Lone Pine to the timber up Ladd creek. He moved his family to the Canyon today and the company will be ready to resume active construction within the course of two weeks, or as soon as the weather permits. During the winter, a small crew has been kept at work unloading steel but with the arrival

of spring, the Masters-Ewoldt company, the builders, will commence active construction and have, through General Manager J. F. Ravenscroft of this city employed Mr. Matott in the road work. Mr Matott was for several years roadmaster for the Utah & Northwestern, later with the O-W, as roadmaster, then with the Nibley-Minnaugh people of Wallowa and it is generally agreed that the Masters-Ewoldt people have a competent man in charge.

The road is to tap the big timber belt on the two forks of Ladd creek and means the active operations of the mill at Lone Pine.
