HOGS REGAIN FORMER TONE

GENERAL TREND OF MARKETS IS HIGHER.

Chicago Market is Weaker, However, Than Earlier in Week.

Portland, March 21.—(Special)—There was only a small run of live-stock in the North Portland yards yesterday afternoon. General conditions in the trade show little change from recent days. There was a steady to firm tone for cattle and the better

class of offerings are in very good demand at the prices quoted. Cows and heifers are bringing more in proportion to their usual worth than steers, although the latter market is unusually favorable whenever quality offerings are available.

At Chicago there was a weak tone in the cattle trade with no change in prices.

Sales of hogs in the North Portland yards during the last 24 hours were made as high as \$9.15, thereby regaining the previous loss of a nickel. There was only a small run of hogs in the yards today, but the trend of the trade was rather fair at unchanged prices during the morning.

At Chicago there was a weaker tone in the hog trade, with a loss of 5 to 10c in the price.

Kansas City hog market was a dime lower than yesterday.
