BAKER POLICE IS PUZZLED

MAN SHOT THERE THURSDAY IS FROM LA GRANDE

Local Officials Know Nothing About Man With La Grande Checks.

Baker, Ore., March 24.—The Democrat says: It developed yesterday that the wife of John Carroll, the man shot by Pinney Currey Thursday night, has been in this city since last Monday instead of La Grande, as the authorities supposed. She and her husband came here together and as he is a cook by trade she thought nothing of his disappearance in the belief that he had gone to some mining camp to work for a few days.

She had not read the papers and did not know until yesterday that her husband was in the hospital when informed by a neighbor. She immediately went to see him and then came to the sheriff and told her story. She does not make very clear the conditions under which they left La Grande and came here. She and her husband had but recently met after a separation of some months and some of her statements are conflicting.

Among the effects of the injured man was found a bank book of the First National bank of Parkersburg, W. Va., with the original name scratched out and Carroll's name substituted. Also a number of blank checks on a La Grande bank were found and admitting that he had no account there, the officers are questioning the reason for his possessing them. The authorities at La Grande can give no information as to his record and as he refuses himself to talk, it is difficult to get a line on his past career.
