**NYSSA BOOMS VIA RAILROAD**

O. S. L. SAID TO BE PLANNING SHOPS THERE.

Branch Junction of O.-W. Also Adds to Nyssa's Commercial Activity.

The Vale Enterprise, which in the past has been able to forecast railroad development in Malheur county with an accuracy which led many to believe its utterances were more than guess work, but emanated from some source near railroad headquarters, last week contained the following:

"It is practically certain that the Oregon Short Line railroad company is purchasing a large acreage near Nyssa, and that Nyssa is congratulating itself that there will be shops built there for the reason that the O.-W. R. & N. company will branch out from that point with the Oregon Eastern.

"This being true it leads to the resumption of the old speculation that the O. S. L. would sell or lease to the O.-W. R. & N. the line from Huntington to the point of junction with the Oregon Eastern, wherever that might be.

"It is probable that it will be laid in the summer before rails are laid through the Malheur canyon, as the tunnel has still 500 feet of heading to make and then the benches to take up.

"The track is now laid within a short distance of the tunnel, greatly to the benefit of the Utah Construction company, as it saves the long and costly haul of coal and other material."

**Reception Is Good.**

Pendleton, March 25.—(Special)—Shortly after 2:30 in the afternoon of Sunday, the Knights Templar of Pendleton, La Grande and Baker, about 150 in number, clad in their uniforms and plumed hats, filed into the auditorium of the high school where already many people had gathered for the annual Eastern Oregon Knights Templar Easter services. There they listened to splendid Easter address by Rev. S. L. Grigsby of the local Presbyterian church who was once prelate of the grand commandery of the state of Kansas. Rev. Grigsby's sermon was a strong one, well worth hearing and well worth reading.

Splendid music also marked the services of the Knights, Mrs. Carl Power, Mrs. J. S. Landers, Mrs. J. R. Dickson and Miss Edna Zimmerman singing beautiful solos and the male quartet, Messrs Akers, Mayberry, Owen and Jordan, also sang a number.

From the time they arrived in the night, the visiting Knights were royally entertained by their local brothers. During the morning they were taken to the Eastern Oregon branch through the buildings. At noon they dined where they were shown were guests at a luncheon in the Masonic temple and in the evening they sat down to the banquet board in the Moose hall. Many of the wives of Knights were present and were guests of the wives of Pendleton members of the order.

**Churchill for Superintendent.**

Portland, Ore., March 24.—It is rumored here that should State Superintendent of Schools Alderman accept the superintendency of the Portland schools his successor is likely to be J. A. Churchill, superintendent of the Baker schools. It is reported that Governor West has endorsed Churchill for the place.

The question is still in doubt as it is not yet definitely known that Mr. Alderman will be chosen as the head of the Portland schools. From indications, however, he will be given the place on the 1st of April.

Portland school board tomorrow and if he does Mr. Churchill will probably succeed him.
