Other News Items From the Lumber Village.

Perry, March 28.—(Special.)—The Union Sunday school gave an Easter service Sunday afternoon, before a large audience, which was considered by all present as excelling any previous effort.

The service setting forth in complete chronological sequence the events of the Resurrection day entitled "The Easter Story" in song and story was rendered by a chorus of school members under the direction of Superintendent Trayner with Mrs. Matt Coalwell as reader and George W. Perry as organist. Lloyd Kelly delivered the sermonette in a pleasing manner.

The interior of the building was artistically decorated with palms, flowers, Easter colors, purple and white, and unique crepe paper borders around the walls typical of Easter.

The program although very pretentious for a small school was well rendered justifying the selection of a difficult task in preparation.

At the close of the service all present were presented with a "Bunny Basket," containing moss and candy eggs together with a bangle from which was suspended a small cross and Easter lily.

Prior to the advent of the present Union school, no permanent religious services had been conducted in this community. The school was organized December 14, 1910 with Mr. C. B. Pickens of La Grande as superintendent and Jacob H. Trayner of this place as assistant. Upon retirement of Mr. Pickens in September 1911, who was leaving for western Oregon, Mr. Trayner took charge of the school and has continued as superintendent ever since. Naturally the people of Perry appreciate the evidences of permanency that pervade the Union school and hopes are expressed that it may never discontinue.

New Equipment Coming.

"The Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation company is to receive additional equipment, according to announcement made to J. H. Keeney. A few days ago announcement was made of a large order for locomotives—one of the largest single orders ever made. Immediately following comes a correspondingly large order for freight equipment. This order calls for 5,390 box cars, 100,000 pounds capacity and 2050 single deck 80,000 pounds capacity stock cars. The cost of this equipment, which will be divided with the Union Pacific and Chicago & Anton systems is \$8,619,150.

While the proportion which will come to the O. W. R. & N. is not definitely stated in the announcement, the distribution will be in accordance with demand. The territory along the line of the O. W. R. & N. is increasing its shipments, and the management is making every endeavor to be able to meet all requirements. To do this during the harvest season necessitates an amount of equipment out of the ordinary, and it is proposed to meet this and every other demand if possible.
