SUGAR QUIET IN WHOLESALE

LACK OF MOVEMENT APPROACHES
EYES WEAK STAGE.

Egg Supply Becoming Pretty Well
Thinned Out in This County.

Quietness, which has not yet become weakness, marks the wholesale sugar trade in La Grande and elsewhere. Local wholesalers have found the market growing quiet in the past few days, and though there is no absolute sign of weakness in sight trade is slow in the sugar line. The expected raise of refined sugar, expected to come after the recent raise in raw material, did not come and, gauging one's guess by the present state of affairs, there will be no immediate increase in prices of the refined goods.

Egg Supply Thinning Out.
Wholesalers and retailers alike are finding that the egg supply is running out; the stiff demand from the consumers following the 20-cent quotations has about exhausted the supplies from the chief centers, Cove, Union, and La Grande, and one critic of market affairs today predicted the market prices prevailing now would soon see a change.
