## REV. DRAHN IS REAL CITIZEN

**BIRNINGS FAMILY TO TAKE LOCAL PASTORATE.**

Comes With Excellent Record as Minister and Organizer.

Rev. William C. Drahn, the newly elected pastor of Zion's Evangelical Lutheran church, preaches his first sermon in La Grande tomorrow at 2:30 p. m.

Mr. Drahn is a graduate of the Wartburg seminary at Dubuque, Iowa and the Chicago Theological seminary of the Evangelical Lutheran church at Chicago and of the Decorah Commercial college of Decorah, Iowa. His preparatory studies were taken at the Wartburg college of Clinton, Iowa and the University of Fayette. He has held pastorates at Chicago, Ill., Victoria B. C. and Vancouver, Washington. During the last five years he has occupied the position of secretary of mission for the Pacific coast district of the Lutheran church. During this time he has organized congregations at Ridgefield, Wash., Seaside, Ore., Victoria, B. C. and Centralia, Wash. In appreciation of his services the board of English home missions voted Pastor Drahn a month's additional salary and all expenses incurred in connection with the work. It is owing to the fact that his children have become of school age and would be able to make little progress in moving from place to place and Mrs. Drahn found the work too arduous that Mr. Drahn resigned his former position. Both he and Mrs. Drahn are delighted with La Grande and claim they have not been disappointed in the many nice things that had been said about the beautiful little city among the hills. Especially has the splendid school system been an attraction to them in choosing a Grande in preference to Spokane and several cities in the east that were open to them for pastorates. The congregation has received Mr. and Mrs. Drahn with the kindest hospitality and has already shown them many kindnesses.
