REV. MEREDITH TO MONTANA

Former Pastor of Enterprise Methodist Church Enters New Field.

(Enterprise Record-Chief) Rev. B. F. Meredith departed Wednesday morning for Glasgow, Mont., where he becomes pastor of the Methodist church at once. He will preach his first sermon Sunday, if he arrives in time, a matter of some doubt with him when he left, after waiting for the delay train on this branch line. Mrs. Meredith and her mother, Mrs. Emma Waugh, will join Mr. Meredith in Glasgow later.

The Montana town is a trifle larger than Enterprise. It is a division terminus on the Great Northern railroad and is the home of many railroad men. In addition to his church duties Mr. Meredith will be interested in the supervision of the Methodist conference hospital at Glasgow. It is conducted by the deaconesses of the church.

In his new pastorate Mr. Meredith succeeds the late Rev. Joel C. Walker who was pastor of the Enterprise Methodist church some years ago. He died recently in Glasgow. Mr. Meredith was pastor of the Enterprise Methodist church two years, resigning last fall. He was a member of

the Idaho conference of the Methodist church for seven years, and was its secretary at the last two annual meetings, preparing the elaborate minutes of the session and attending to much other business. He is very well known all through Wallowa county, having preached or spoken in every town and in many school-houses.

Since his resignation Mr. Meredith has been taking a little vacation from the ministry. He has many warm friends here who will wish him prosperity and happiness in his new field.
