During 1906 the governor of Minnesota was chosen to preside at a convention of governors, attorneys general, and insurance commissioners of the United States to consider the situation with reference to the laws of the various states on the subject of Life Insurance. The result was a committee of fifteen was appointed of which the insurance commissioner of Minnesota was made chairman.

The committee adopted as a working basis the laws passed by the state of New York upon the recommendation of the Armstrong committee of that state. The result was a code of laws, including standard forms of policies and standard provisions, were recommended. Of seventeen separate measures recommended by this committee, fourteen, with very slight amendments, were enacted into law by the legislature of Minnesota during 1907.
