MORGAN BODY ARRIVES.

Remains to be Closely Guarded by Police Officials—Services Monday

New York, April 11.—The body of Morgan is scheduled to arrive this afternoon on the steamer La France.

It will be taken immediately to the Morgan home, where the remains will be kept until the funeral Monday. Morgan, junior and son Junious went down to the bay this morning to meet the La France at the quarantine dock. Arrangements are made to expedite the landing of the casket.

Flowers have been sent by nearly every bank and big corporation in New York City today to fill the Morgan library. Mayor Gaynor ordered the police to guard the Morgan mansion. Neighboring streets are being patrolled, being practically closed to the public.

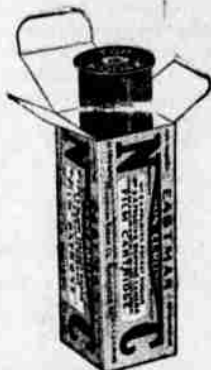
