AUTO HAULS GRAIN WAGON

**APPERSON JACK RABBIT TAKES
WHEAT TO MILL.**

Farmer Rides in Car That Hauls All-cel Wheat.

P. A. Foley of the Apperson Motor Car company tells how a 45 horse power Apperson Jack Rabbit touring car took the place of a heavy draft team Thursday pulling a heavy load of grain a distance of three miles to mill, besides performing at the same time, its regular duties by carrying a load of passengers.

Mr. Curtis, the Apperson representative, J. W. McCormack of Pendleton and Mr. Foley went out to call on a prominent farmer in the vicinity of Alice Thursday and finding him busy delivering some grain to the mill at Imbler, they proposed putting his work horses in the stable and hooking the heavily loaded farm wagon on behind their Apperson touring car, so that the interview could be carried on while they finished delivering his grain to the mill.

Taking on a total load of 6055 pounds they drove to the mill—pulling through long mud holes, and selecting a devious route in order to get to pull it through a long stretch of very sandy road.

In the meantime the owner of the grain was sitting luxuriously in the automobile and the desired interview was carried on in comfort.

This unusual performance excited no small amount of surprise along the road. One neighbor on horseback decided to overtake the procession to get a closer view of the performance but his horse evidently was not so "long winded" as the Jack Rabbit for he never caught up.
