Gardens of the Bosphorus.

The gardens of the Bosphorus are one of the most characteristic features of that river-like strait. They have, moreover, a definite cachet of their own. This is largely prescribed to them by the nature of the soil on which they are laid out. The banks of the Bosphorus slope sharply back to a height of some 400 feet and are broken by valleys penetrating more gradually into the rolling tablelands of Thrace and Asia Minor. Few of their houses, therefore, do not enjoy some view of the water and of the opposite shore, rarely more than a mile or two away. The gardens of the houses are accordingly laid out with reference to those views and are determined in form by the steepness of the hillside on which they lie. They are terraces—that is, one or many according to the size of the garden.—Scribner's.

He Wouldn't Respond.

When Joseph Miller's play, "The Danites," was produced for the first time the play caught the crowd's fancy and at the end of the second act there were great calls from the audience for "Author, author!" The manager looked around for Miller, but could not find him.
