William A. Brown of Chicago is to speak twice in La Grande next Sunday. We are indeed very fortunate in being able to announce Mr. Brown for our city. The local Y. M. C. A. has very carefully completed arrangements whereby Mr. Brown will spend Sunday with us on his way to the Twin State Sunday school convention to be held at Baker April 21, 22, 23. Rev. Wm. A. Brown is at the head of the missionary department of the International Sunday School association. He was a member of team number three of the Men and Religion Forward movement and was considered one of the strongest speakers of the team. He speaks at the Y. M. C. A. men's meeting at 3:30 p. m. in the Christian church. Because of the cramped condition of the present Y. M. C. quarters it seemed best to hold this big meeting in the Christian church building. A strong male chorus under the direction of Prof. G. H. Armstrong will furnish the meeting with delightful special music. All men and older boys of the city are invited to attend this meeting.

Mr. Brown will give his second address of the day at the Baptist church in the evening. This is a union meeting of all denominations. In this service the united choirs of the city will supply the music. To this evening meeting, all are most cordially invited.
