Gaelic Celebration Tonight. New York, April 23.—Episodes in Irish National history will be pictured this evening when the Gaelic League of the Irish-American committee holds its spectacular pageant and Gaelic Festival in 69th Regiment Armory. Pittsburg, April 23.—Several fatalities are reported and nearly 100 miners are believed to be pinned in as the result of an explosion which wrecked two entries into the Cincinnati mine at Courtney. The company admits an explosion occurred. Some of the dead miners have been removed from the mine.
